January is a strange month; technically the Christmas season continues until 2nd February but alongside this, looking back to Christmas, there is the urge to look forward and start the New Year with new things. Perhaps the Romans were right to picture their God, Janus, with two faces so that he could look both ways at once.

It makes me call to mind the words of St Paul, admittedly in a different context, (writing to the Corinthian church about the Eucharist) saying, 'I receive from the Lord what I also passed onto you'. Often in life we have to look two ways at once, that we give as we receive. That is definitely a feature of my diary and absence from the benefice in January.

I am receiving, as the diocese is sending me on a residential course, but I am also giving, as I have been invited to be part of the spiritual guidance available on a retreat the diocese is running at the end of the month. Giving and receiving also goes on in our relationship to the broader diocese and I am very grateful that Canon Andrew Vessey will be leading the Holy Communion services in the benefice when I am away, so we receive something from the diocese just as in turn others in the diocese receive from my ministry which you so generously and graciously support in many ways.

Giving and receiving from one another was what knitted the early church together, as the Body of Christ. I rather expect that as 2014 unfolds, we will find that as a benefice we increasingly give as we receive from each other in all sorts of different ways and become knit together as part of the Body of Christ.
